



National Wireless Holdings Inc

National Wireless Holdings Inc was co-founded by Landover to act as a holding and strategic resource company for wireless cable systems. Landover raised \$25 million through an initial public offering in March 1994 (NASDAQ:NWIR) and subsequently acquired wireless spectrum in a top 10 US market. Landover strategically partnered with BellSouth, and later negotiated the sale of its spectrum to BellSouth for \$48 million in 1996.

Advanced Radio Telecom Corp

Advanced Radio Telecom was co-founded by Landover recognizing the demand to provide an infrastructure solution for broadband last mile services by using wireless 38 GHz technology and bypassing the high cost of deploying fiber optic infrastructure. In 1995 Landover acquired Bell Atlantic's North East footprint for \$7.5 million from the Newhouse family and strategically positioned the wireless spectrum to raise \$225 million in equity and debt (NASDAQ: ARTT). In 1998, Landover sold its controlling interest in Advanced Radio Telecom to Winstar, in a stock-for-stock transaction.

Winstar Communications Inc

Winstar Communications provided facilities-based voice and data telecommunications services to businesses and other customers in major metropolitan areas at highly competitive prices, relative to traditional wired/copper-based carriers, by using 38 GHz wireless spectrum (NASDAQ:WCII). Landover was one of the early investors in 1992 and continued to invest significant capital throughout the decade. By 1998, Landover/LSZ was the largest individual shareholder of Winstar next to Fidelity Technology Fund. Landover sold off its holdings in Winstar in 2000, effectively calling the top of the wireless / telecom market.

Bazillion

Bazillion was co-founded in 1998 by Landover and Vernon Fotheringham, whom, co-founded Advanced Radio Telecom alongside Landover. Bazillion provided Voice-Over-IP (VOIP) over its own network and covered 40% of the US population, in addition, to providing DSL service to residential consumers. Landover was the largest investor and shareholder in Bazillion. The company began construction of VOIP overlays to certain wireless local loop markets that Landover / companies last mile networks built both in the US and Europe.
